- GCSE English, Science and Maths at grade 4 or above/ A*-C or equivalent.
- If English is not the applicant's first language a certificated level of proficiency of at least IELTS 7.0 (6.0 FdSc), (Academic level), or equivalent English Language qualification, as recognised by Anglia Ruskin University.
