time required

- b. Relevant local authority policies and procedures relating to carers in order to respond to questions about local interpretation of carers legislation and guidance.

activity six - level 2

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2. Give participants a copy of activity six handout and ask them in pairs to decide if the statements are true or false.
3. Bring the group back together and using the activity six PowerPoint work through the answers one at a time with participants. Invite responses to each question and using the slides highlight key legislation which gives carers their own legal rights to assessment and services.

what other approaches might I consider?

- Shall I select certain statements and slides, depending on the focus of the training and the time available?
- Could I invite participants to identify what they see as being the legal rights of the carer using a locally developed case study and get them to explore in small groups how the legislation and guidance that they have just explored supports those rights?
